Saturday, May 6 (10:00 am – 5:00 pm) through Sunday, May 7 (11:00 am to 4:00 pm) celebrates ArtWalk, a juried fine art show sponsored by Arts for Rural Texas (ARTS) celebrated on the courthouse square in Fayetteville. With over 60 participating artists showcased and over \$6,000 in award money given to the artists selected by a judges panel, this show is quickly becoming a popular event throughout the State of Texas. Promoting local, regional, and national artists is the initial goal and visitors are reminded that in addition to this show, there is a schedule of performing musicians, children's art instruction /activities, wine tastings, food booths, and other attractions that makes this an unforgettable experience with memories to take home. This is a free event with proceeds going to art for the kiddos in the area—a real "win-win" and proves that a professional showing of fine art for all can indeed be conducted in a small community. Catch your "second wind" because after ARTS activities Saturday, May 6, festivities move right down the road at 302 Bell Street to the Annual Volunteer Fire Department Fundraiser and Dance kicking off at 5:00 pm at the St. John Catholic Church Pavilion. This too is an annual event with children's activities and Central Texas Sounds Polka Band performing from 4:30 pm to 7:30 pm in the hall. Bar-b-que beef, pork, and sausage are served from 5:30 – 7:30 pm and a silent and live auction kick off at 6:30 pm. After the auction, The Anthony Moreno Band, sponsored by Bentwood Ranch, performs. This is a very important fundraiser for this volunteer group as the department operates on donations only. The following weekend (Saturday, May 13) spotlights another round of the Fayetteville Picking Park as live acoustic bluegrass jamming commences on the historic square. Expect world-class performances by musicians from New York, Hungary, Poland, Houston, and Austin in a closed environment with natural acoustics and in keeping with the Czech heritage of the community, Czech music will be performed on the Friday
