Fall in Fayetteville Brings a Festive Flavor of History, Music, and "Junk" (yes, junk)

It's not very difficult to discover something "going on" in Fayetteville and as fall presents a pastry collage of colorful creativity, this incredible National Registry District community is preparing for a fall blitz of activities and fun in history will not be shelved!

The Fayetteville Area Heritage Museum (on the square) will celebrate an open house on Saturday, September 19 from 11:00 am to 2:00 pm. This is no regular "open house" because Mr. Edgar von Minden will be present. Mr. von Minden, a native to Fayetteville made his hometown his retirement home as well and in 2008, he began constructing replicas of historic structures located throughout the town. Using balsa wood, corrugated tin, matchsticks, and other objects, Edgar devoted an enormous amount of man hours to hand cut the wood and construct these replicas as part of his commitment to authenticity and detail--what a hobby!!

One of these replicas is the "Gulf Station" (replica pictured), purchased in July of 1935 by Alvin Onken. The station was also the Kerrville Bus Station and Mr. von Minden's father

worked there while the family feed store was across the street. The station was closed in 1958. If you have never heard of the Miniatures of Fayetteville now on display, here's a great opportunity to visit a very special museum in the niche of a hometown community insurmountable with hospitality, history, and creativity. The hours may vary, some days a little earlier for opening, and often remaining open later in the evening. Vendors with their precious treasures journey from Louisiana, Kansas, Oklahoma, Arkansas, Tennessee, and other parts of Texas. Merchandise included is everything from fine art to primitives, silver, outdoor garden, furniture, quilts, tools, advertising, and much more for those one of a kind finds.
